Look at these sentences.

My **mother** and **father** are both doctors.

I saw two **hens** and one **cock** in the coop.

The **lioness** and the **lion** are inside the cave.

The words *mother*, *hen* and *lioness* all refer to the females of the same species and the words *father*, *cock* and *lion* refer to the males of the same species.

Nouns are divided into four types on the basis of their gender.

A noun which refers to a male is said to be of the **masculine gender**.

Examples: *father, uncle, boy, hero, steward*

A noun which refers to a female is said to be of the **feminine gender**.

Examples: *mother, aunt, girl, heroine, stewardess*

A noun which can refer to both a male and a female is said to be of the **common gender**.

Examples: *dentist, child, parent, cousin*

A noun which refers to a non-living thing is said to be of the **neuter gender**. It is neither male nor female.

Examples: *pen, car, table, building*
