Types of prepositions

Prepositions of place

Prepositions of place show the **place** or **position** of a noun.

For example,

- The little girl sat **on** a stool.
- The cat hid **under** the bed.



Prepositions of movement or direction

Prepositions of movement or direction show the **movement** of a noun or pronoun.

For example,

- The boys walked **into** the room.
- The horse ran **across** the field.

Prepositions of time

Prepositions of time are used to show the **time of an action**. For example,

- **After** dinner, we walk a mile.
- We are going to the zoo **on** Sunday.

Prepositions of agency

Prepositions of agency show **who** did something or **with what** something was done is, the **agents**. For example,

- This house was built **by** my father.
- He built it **with** his own design.

Prepositions of manner

Prepositions of manner show the manner in which something is done. For example,

- We heard the story **with** interest.
